The Loft Artists Association is pleased to announce our 8th Annual Juried Exhibit titled Chiaroscuro: The Art of Light and Dark. The exhibit runs from October 16 through November 7, 2021, with an opening reception and awards ceremony on Saturday, October 16, from 5 – 7 PM. The exhibit is open to all artists in Connecticut, New York and New Jersey.

The concept of Chiaroscuro has been evident throughout art history since the 5th C. in Greece, with more extensive use resuming in the 15th C. to today. The use of light (chiaro) and shadow (scuro) assists in creating three dimensionality and drama to two-dimensional works of art. Contemporary use of this technique is found in drawing, painting, mixed media, printmaking and photographic works. The use of a single light source assists in creating this effect.

The juror for the exhibit will be Nancy McTague-Stock. Nancy brings excellent credentials to this exhibit opportunity. She was a Fellowship Recipient for post-graduate work at The Slade School of Art at the University of London in Experimental Drawing. She received an MFA from The Art Institute of Boston in Visual Studies in New Media, a Marketing Strategy Certificate from Cornell University's Johnson Graduate School of Management, and a BFA from Virginia Commonwealth University in Metalsmithing and Textiles. A periodic lecturer about contemporary art, environment and culture, Nancy has also combined her studio practice with work as a teacher, artists' mentor, arts writer, curator and juror for many academic private and public institutions, including The Price of Wales Foundation in the UK.
